## DESCRIPTION

Ceiling lamp with diffused light. White satin finish hand-blown diffuser achieved using a glass blowing procedure without turning the glass in the mould (referred to as "stationary") with special incisions of diagonal and horizontal lines inside it. An anchoring solution has been designed using a smaller ring nut that adapts the glass to a standard mount for different models and can be glimpsed discretely, making the glass the absolute main feature of the space. The ceiling version guarantee diffused intense and warm lighting in the room through the precious blown glass diffuser.

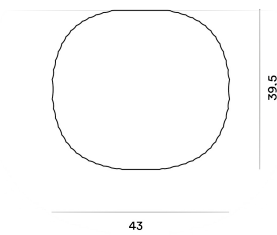

A fluid vibration on glass, with special craftsmanship that makes Gem lamp unique also when off. The three-dimensional facets, with lines intersecting on the surface, are made by blowing glass into an etched mould.

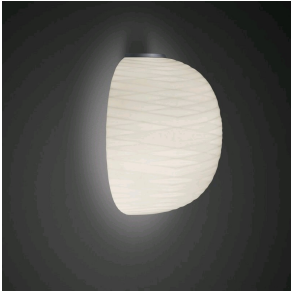
